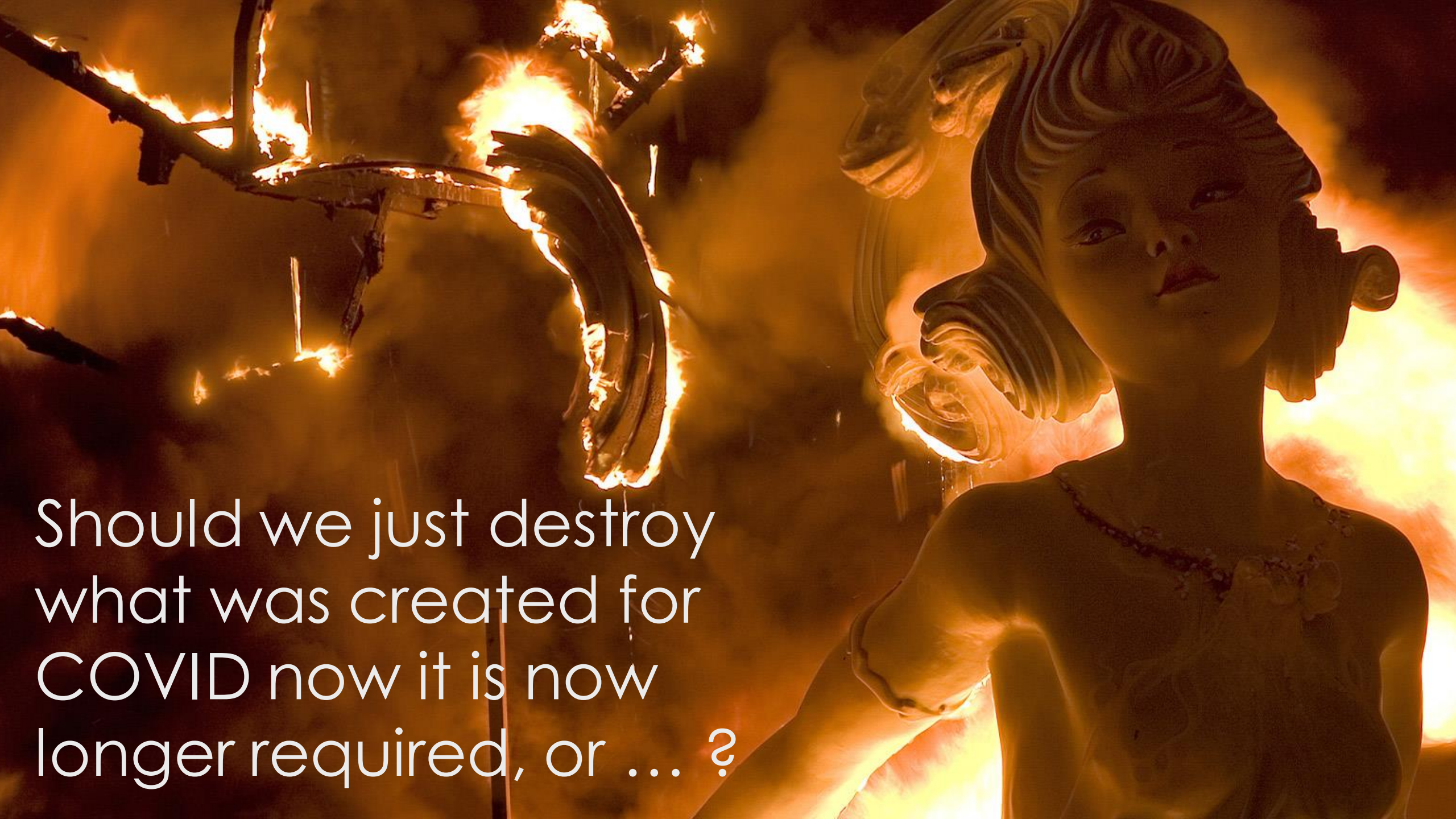

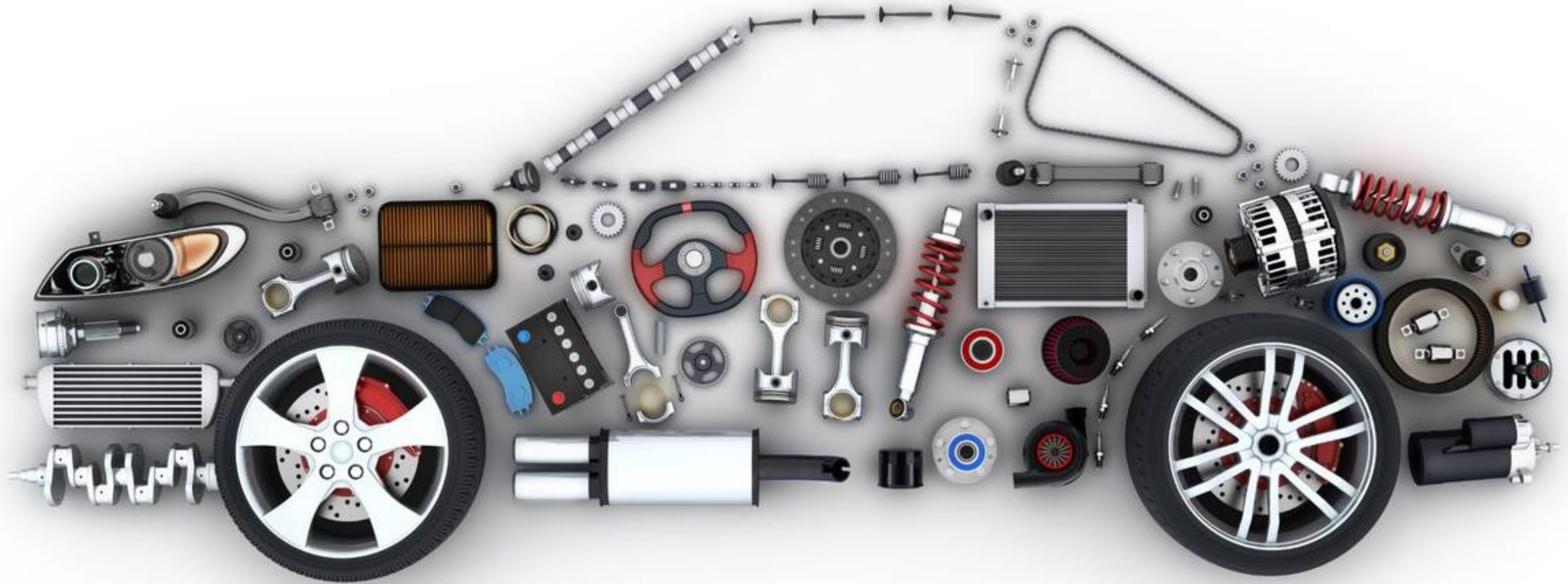

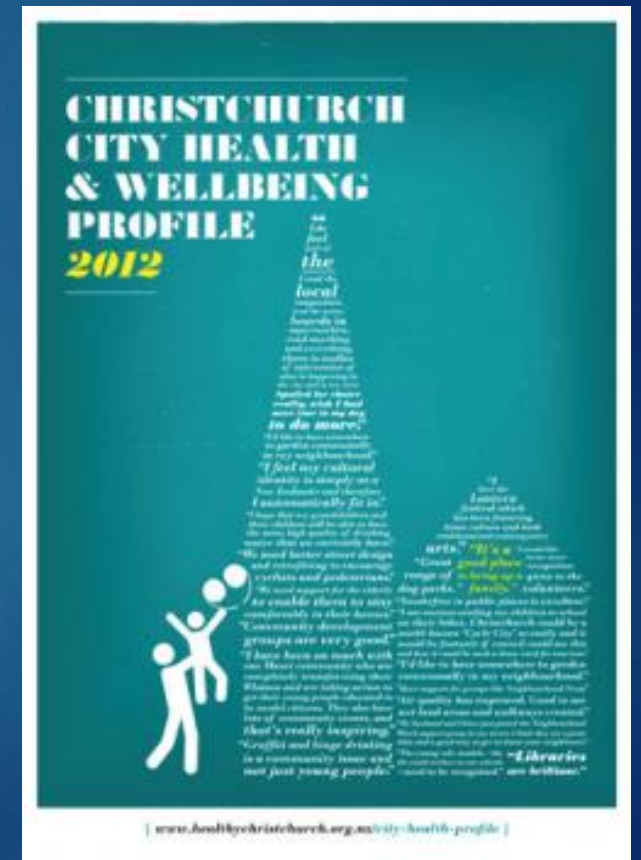

# Health in all Policies

- ▶ Unless maintained, other sectors would seek to exclude health from policy decisions in other sectors in retribution to the damage wreaked by the pandemic.
- ▶ Health considerations increase costs upfront; to highlight new markets eg healthy tourism.
- ▶ Nonetheless, policy makers are more aware of the need to take on board health's feedback on several policies.





# Whole-of-society links maintained

- ▶ WHO Europe is collaborating with UNWTO on a joint strategy with an aim to strengthen ties between tourism and public health in Europe's smallest states.
- ▶ Towards *'healthy tourists, healthy communities, a healthy environment, and healthy economies for current and future generations'* (Zurab Pololikashvili, Secretary General, UNWTO)

# Surveillance systems

- ▶ Pandemic not over yet ...
- ▶ Ensure that systems built for COVID can be easily adapted to new epidemics.



# eHealth interoperability



- ▶ Most extensive
- ▶ Fastest
- ▶ Most secure
- ▶ Put in place by high, middle & low income countries.
- ▶ Clear demonstration that interoperability of specific health record elements is possible.

# Vaccine technology has evolved greatly...



▶ Prior to pandemic, mRNA vaccines were still in development for a host of diseases, including non-infectious conditions like multiple sclerosis & cancer, but not yet in licensed meds.

▶ The experience gained with the use of mRNA vaccines will facilitate the development of new vaccines for several neglected tropical diseases.
