<p>Don't you think that infodemic can be used as a tool for hostile influence information activities, especially in times of war?</p>	<p>the same mechanisms and attributes that make people vulnerable to the infodemic and misinformation makes people also vulnerable to disinformation and information warfare during conflict/war. but the actors peddling disinformation do not specifically target health - health is one of aspects that is attacked in information warfare in order to generally destabilize trust in authorities or to gain financial gain. in health sector, we can focus on misinformation and infodemic more effectively. There are other parts of government that can respond to disinformation better than the Ministry of Health.</p>
<p>were these 678 infodemic managers were already working with communication professionals across the health system or just WHO professionals?</p>	<p>they are working across all agencies -- even in UNICEF, but also as freelancers, in MoH, civil society etc. we have 132 countries represented in the community and the community supports also your training now. many infodemic managers from the community are your coaches today.</p>
<p>How do we deal with infodemics on social media which is spread by bluetooth in countries with limited or no internet</p>	<p>this requires integrated analysis and response --- we will talk about this in next lectures on social listening and also in the IM toolbox lecture</p>

Fun fact: Tina is the team lead for the infodemic management team within the section of WHO that does emergency preparedness and response. Weaving in IM into preparedness and emergency activities is critical, especially since many of those emergencies and outbreaks become vaccine-preventable, meaning it means strong health system collaboration to engage communities to mitigate the infodemic.</p>
